Summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2017

(Amount in rupees unless otherwise stated)

1 Company overview

Moser Baer Entertainment Limited (the "Company")/ ("MBEL"), a public limited company was incorporated on 14 September 2006. Its business primarily encompasses distribution of storage optical media, contents including replication of contents and various solid state lighting (LED) products.

2 Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under historical cost convention on an accrual basis, in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014. All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current, wherever applicable as per the operating cycle of the Company as per the guidance as set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013.

3 Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the principles generally accepted in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Example of such estimates include provisions for doubtful debts/ advances, employee retirement benefit plans, provision for income taxes, useful life of fixed assets, other probable obligations and inventory write down. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in the current and future periods.

4 Significant accounting policies

(a) Revenue recognition

(i) Revenue from sale of goods

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the customer and when no significant uncertainty exists regarding realisation of the consideration. Sales are recorded net of sales returns, rebates, trade discounts and price differences, if any.

(ii) Interest income

Interest is accounted for based on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount invested and the rate of interest.

(b) Fixed assets

(i) Tangible assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes all expenses, direct and indirect, specifically attributable to its acquisition and bringing it to its working condition for its intended use.

(ii) Intangible assets

Intangible assets are being amortised on a straight line basis over the useful life, not exceeding 10 years, as estimated by management to be the economic life of the asset over which economic benefits are expected to flow.

Impairment, if any, in the carrying value of fixed assets is assessed at the end of each financial period in accordance with the accounting policy given below on "Impairment of Assets".

(c) Depreciation and amortisation

(i) Tangible assets

Depreciation on tangible fixed assets is provided under straight-line method at rates specified in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956, being representative of the useful lives of tangible fixed assets. Effective 01 January 2015, depreciation on tangible fixed assets is provided under straight-line method based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

Depreciation on additions is being provided on pro-rata basis from the date of such additions. Similarly, depreciation of assets sold/disposed off during the year is being provided upto the date on which assets are sold/disposed off.

In respect of assets whose useful life has been revised, the unamortized depreciable amount is charged over the revised remaining useful life.

(ii) Intangible assets

Intangible assets other than copyrights/marketing and distribution rights are amortized on equated basis over their estimated economic life not exceeding 10 years.

Copyrights/ marketing and distribution rights are amortized from the date they are available for use, at the higher of the amount calculated on a straight line basis over the period the intangible asset is available for exploitation to the Company, not exceeding 10 years, and the number of units sold during the period basis.

Brand licenses and acquired goodwill are amortized using straight-line method over a period of 3 years.

(d) Inventories

(i) Traded goods

Traded goods held for resale are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value.

Cost of traded goods is determined on the basis of weighted average cost method.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated cost to affect the sale.

Provision for inventory write down is made below cost based on management's best estimate of net realizable value.

(e) Employee benefits

Salaries, bonus and other short term benefits are accrued in the period in which the associated services are rendered by the employees of the Company.

(i) Provident fund and employees' state insurance

The Company makes contribution to statutory provident fund which is recognized by the income tax authorities in accordance with Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous provisions Act, 1952 which is a defined contribution plan. These funds are administered through Regional Provident Fund Commissioner and contribution paid or payable is recognized as an expense in the period in which the services are rendered by the employee. The Company has no legal or constructive obligations to pay further contributions after payment of the fixed contribution.

The Company's contributions to State plans namely Employee's State Insurance Fund and Employee's Pension Scheme 1995 are charged to statement of profit and loss in the period such contribution is due to be made.

(ii) Gratuity

Gratuity is a post employment benefit and is in the nature of defined benefit plan. The liability recognized in the balance sheet in respect of gratuity is the present value of the defined benefit obligation as at the balance sheet date less the fair value of plan assets, together with adjustments for the unrecognized actuarial gains or losses. Gratuity Fund is administered through Life Insurance Corporation of India. The defined benefit obligation is calculated at the balance sheet date on the basis of actuarial valuation by an independent actuary using projected unit credit method. Actuarial gains or losses arising from experience adjustments and changes in actuarial assumptions are recorded as expense or income in the statement of profit and loss in the period in which such gains and losses arise.

(iii) Unavailed leaves

The Company also provides a benefit of compensated absences to its employees which are in the nature of long term benefit plan. The compensated absences comprises of vesting as well as non vesting benefit. Liability in respect of compensated absences becoming due and expected to be availed within one year from the balance sheet date is recognized on the basis of undiscounted value of estimated amount required to be paid or estimated value of benefits expected to be availed by the employees. Liability in respect of compensated absences becoming due and expected to be availed more than one year after the balance sheet date is estimated on the basis of an actuarial valuation performed by an independent actuary using the projected unit credit method as on the reporting date. Actuarial gains and losses arising from experience adjustments and changes in actuarial assumptions are recorded in the statement of profit and loss in the period in which such gains or losses arise.

(iv) Other short term benefits

Expense in respect of other short term benefits is recognized on the basis of amount paid or payable for the period during which services are rendered by the employees.

(f) Foreign currency transactions

(i) Initial recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

(ii) Subsequent recognition

Foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are reported using the closing rate as the reporting date. Non-monetary items are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency, are reported using the exchange rates at the date of the transaction and non-monetary items which are carried at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rates that existed when the values were determined.

(iii) Exchange differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting Company's monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year or reported in previous financial statements, are recognized as income or expense in the period in which they arise.

(g) Taxes

Tax expense comprises current tax and deferred tax.

Current tax

Current tax is determined as the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income for the period. The provision for current income-tax is recorded based on the applicable provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961 on assessable income and the tax rate applicable to the relevant assessment year.

Deferred tax

Deferred income taxes reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years. Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. In respect of carry forward losses and unabsorbed depreciation, deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such losses can be set off.

Further, deferred tax asset appearing in books is reviewed at each reporting date and is written down to the extent it is not certain that the Company will pay taxes on future incomes against which such deferred tax asset may be adjusted.

(h) Leases

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased assets, are classified as 'Operating Leases'. Lease rentals in respect of assets taken under operating leases are charged to the statement of profit and loss on straight line basis over the term of lease.

(i) Impairment of assets

The Company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset or recoverable amount of cash generating unit to which the asset belongs is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount and the reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognized in the statement of profit and loss. If at the balance sheet date there is no indication that if a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists, the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is reflected at the recoverable amount subject to a maximum of depreciated historical cost.

(j) Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period/year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

(k) Provisions and contingent liabilities

The Company creates a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of obligation.

A disclosure of contingent liability is made when there is a:

- possible obligation, the existence of which will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain events, not fully within the control of the Company;
- present obligation, where it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation;
- present obligation, where a reasonable estimate cannot be made.

Where there is a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no disclosure is made.

(1) Segment reporting

Business segments

For management purposes, the Company reviews the performance on the basis of business units identified as 'Storage media products' and 'Solid state lighting', which are reportable segments. Revenue, assets and liabilities in respect of other electronic goods traded by the Company are reported as 'Others'.

Geographic segments

The Company operates primarily in India, which is considered a single geographical segment as per Accounting Standard 17 on 'Segment Reporting' prescribed by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006.

Other information

All segment revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities are directly attributable to the segments and disclosed accordingly. Segment revenues, expenses and results include transfers between business segments.

The accounting policies consistently used in the preparation of the financial statement are also applied to revenues and expenditure of individual segments.

Company's operations are dependent on the business from holding company.
